*Teachers begin their teaching career with an Intern Credential, are employed & paid by their school districts, are the Teacher of Record for their classroom, work closely with a Support Supervisor, & attend evening credential classes in a cohort model one to two times a week for two years. A BA/BS from an accredited institution, pre-service coursework, successful passing of the Basic Skills Requirement, subject matter competency, & U.S. Constitution are required before enrolling in the IMPACT Intern Program.

**CTE Teachers are required to secure a teaching position and apply for their Preliminary Designated Subjects CTE Teaching Credential prior to enrolling in the Initial Preparation, TCSJ CTE Credential Program. Program is 15-18 months, depending on start date.
