I.) Schedule:

- ♣ Chavez, Edison, and Stagg currently have the 4 X 4 block schedule
- ♣ Periods are roughly 90 minutes long
- Classes change after the winter break
- ♣ Max SAI- 3 periods for M/M students on the 4 x 4 each term
- ♣ Franklin-A/B block; 8 classes on a rotating basis; classes are for the entire year
- Periods are roughly 90 minutes long
- ♣ Max-6 SAI classes on A/B block
- +All comprehensive high schools have a minimum day once a week

II.) Academic Support:

- Learning Center- ALL four comprehensive high schools have a Learning Center
- SAI Core and support/intervention classes are offered
- ♣ Academic support/study skills classes are offered to support GEN ED CORE classes
- ♣ Tutoring

III.) General Expectations:

- Students in M/M programs will move from class to class each period; even M/S students may move among classes (supervised)
- ❖ Students are expected to dress out for PE and participate in activities
- ♣ Bell-to-bell engagement
