## Course Descriptions

### A J 21 Criminal Justice in Society - 3 Units

*Advisories*: Ability to read at 12th grade level | This course introduces the characteristics of the U.S. criminal justice system, particularly the structure and function of US police, courts, and corrections. Focus is placed on crime measurement, explanations of/responses to crime, components of the system, and current challenges. Students are introduced to the origins and development of criminal law, legal process, and sentencing and incarceration policies. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID AJ 110)

### COUN 30 Career Self-Assessment - 1 Unit

This course is designed to introduce students to the career life planning process. The course emphasizes self-assessment as the first major step in the career life planning process. Students identify their personality, values, interests, skills and accomplishments leading to potential career choices. (CSU)

### **COUN 31 Career Exploration - 1 Unit**

This course is designed to provide the student with opportunities to explore specific careers through utilization of the Career Transfer Center and internet resources. The course includes investigation of job duties, training, educational requirements, desired employee characteristics, salary ranges, and future employment trends. (CSU)

### **ENG 1A Reading and Composition - 3 Units**

Advisories: Ability to read at 12th grade level. Must submit prerequisite clearance form to enroll. This is a transfer-level, college freshman English composition course comparable to those courses offered by the state college and university systems. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID ENGL 100)

### **ENG 38 Mythology - 3 Units**

This course is designed to provide the student with an introduction to the literature of Greek, Roman, and Norse mythology. Other universal myths may be included. The course provides a background for understanding of allusions, form, and content of recurring themes in modern literature as well as revealing the continued influence of mythological motifs on customs, traditions, beliefs, and values. (HBCU, UC, CSU)

### FCS 6 Nutrition - 3 Units

This course presents scientific concepts of nutrition related to the function of nutrients in basic life processes and current health issues. Emphasis is given to the role of food choices and physical activity on health, body weight, and risk of disease. Students undertake a self-study of personal dietary intake and habits compared to the Dietary Guidelines for Americans. (HBCU, UC, CSU)

### **HIST 17A History of the United States - 3 Units**

Advisories: Ability to read at the 12th grade level | This course surveys US history from its pre-colonial beginnings through the Civil War and Reconstruction. Topics include geographical regions encompassed by the United States, initial cultural contact, European settlements, racial, class, religious, and gender conflicts, immigration, the development of a national identity. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID HIST 130)

### **PSYCH 1 Introduction to Psychology - 3 Units**

Advisories: Ability to read at 12th grade level | Psychology is the scientific study of behavior and mental processes. This course focuses on the exploration of major psychological theories and concepts, methods, and research findings in psychology. Topics include the biological bases of behavior, perception, cognition, learning, memory, emotion, motivation, personality, social psychology, & psychological disorders. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID PSY 110)

### **SPAN 2 Elementary Spanish II - 5 Units**

Prerequisites: SPAN 1 Elementary Spanish I or two years high school Spanish w/ grade of 'C' or better. This course continues to teach Spanish language acquisition in a cultural context. Emphasis is placed on communication skills (listening, speaking, reading, writing) and cultural understanding (behaviors, institutions, perspectives and artistic manifestations.) The student will continue to interact with authentic language in a cultural context. (HBCU, UC, CSU, C-ID SPAN 110)
