
- Each observation chart has one Initial Parent Notification Letter and one Annual Parent Notification Letter

- The purpose of the Annual Parent Notification Letter is to inform parents of their child's **continued identification** as an English Learner in a California school, and provide all the required information to meet Federal Title I or Title III requirements.

 - Language Acquisition Programs
 - Description of Program Options
 - Graduation Rate for English Learners
 - Long Term English Learner (LTEL)/At-Risk of Becoming a Long Term English Learner (ARTEL)
 - Reclassification Criteria

Alternate Annual Parent Notification Letter (AAPNL)

- The purpose of the Alternate Annual Parent Notification Letter is to inform parents of their child's continued identification as an English Learner who is eligible to take an alternative assessment in a California school, and provide all the required information to meet Federal Title I or Title III requirements.
