What is your goal with your students?



The Importance of Communication

Communication is the basis for all types of relationships, between couples, parents and children, teachers and parents, doctor and patient, etc.

Without good communication problems and misunderstandings can arise. We must give it the importance it deserves and teach good communication to our children and practice it whenever necessary.

Effective communication is one where ideas, thoughts, knowledge and information can be transmitted or shared in the easiest way for the receiver of the message to understand.

There must be clarity in communication and sincerity on both sides from the one communicating and the one receiving the message.

It is recommended for good communication:

- Remove or set aside all distractions.
- Make eye contact.
- Get physically on the level of the receiver (the one receiving the message) e.g., squat down or lean forward when talking to a child so you can look them in the eye and not intimidate the child.
- Ask if he/she understood or heard you clearly.
- Ask the receiver to repeat the message back to you.
- Choose an appropriate time and place.
- Good communication does not require shouting.

Pay attention when it is your turn to be the receiver and ask if you have any questions.
